Methodology and framework are a very important component of project management; however, projects / programs are delivered by teamwork and a project / program manager's success is heavily dependent on their team's ability. The art of project management lies in how a project leader effectively uses methodology to get their team to deliver the project outcomes successfully.

Ruchi Motial-Suri, Founder and Principal Consultant at Success Culture and who has over 25 years' corporate leadership experience with blue chip organisations in Asia, Australia & UK specialising in turning around projects from Red to Green. She has led PMI Melbourne community in a hands-on interactive session, sharing her lessons learnt from rescuing projects successfully and sharing valuable Insights on how to use Emotional Intelligence to leverage methodology and manage our team and stakeholders, resulting in predictable results every time.

According to statistics, to summarise Ruchi's presentation, only 39% of project failures occur due to lack of planning. So, what about the other 61%? This failure is attributed to what is collective called "Soft skills". Let's recap the 3 strategies Ruchi shared with us:

- 1. Don't be a slave to methodology. Methodology is just a tool to help you deliver business outcomes focus on the outcomes required, not on the tool.
- 2. Change is inevitable. It's all about how you manage this change and the messaging.
- 3. Lastly, and most importantly-It's all about the people. People collaborate to deliver a common outcome. Your success as the Project Leader lies in how you influence them to deliver as a single team.

- Peter Lam (Member)


The DASIG's partners from the PMI APAC office are:

2022 saw our first expedition to regional Victoria, conducting workshops at Gisborne Secondary Collage and Lauriston Girls College year 9 campus at Howqua. These provided a unique experience to connect with regional schools, providing new perspectives.

At Lauriston, around 100 students (year 9) board for the entire year, staying at Howqua for 5 week stints before returning home for a week. During their boarding, students not only study, but also get assigned a roster for certain activities on campus such helping with cleaning, cooking, setting up the wood heaters heating in classrooms and planning excursions. Learning project management concepts has really helped them to plan their daily work, projects and other activities. The team did not just deliver the workshops, but also had the opportunity to sit with students and teachers for morning tea and lunch. This opportunity provided a connection and bonding with the staff and students. The team is looking forward to going back again next year.

Presentation Abstract.

Covid-19 impacted everyone around the world. It had taken the world into a storm, some have lost the sail, which some have come even stronger. Our chapter has gone strength to strength, not just sailing through the storm but also building a more resilient chapter to adapt to a whole new world. The success story consists of the story from the day one when we cancelled our first event, to the recent Victoria Conference to rebuild and reconnect.

The COVID-19 pandemic has upended nearly every aspect of life, from the personal (how people live and work) to the professional (how companies interact with their customers, how customers choose and purchase products and services, how supply chains deliver them). Chapters around the world have faced challenges with membership retention, professional development, providing networking opportunities, and uncertainties around hosting inperson events. Eventhough life is slightly getting back to normal (subjective), it has brought a whole new challenge, which is rebuilding and reconnecting.

PMI Melbourne chapter has adapted to respond to the crisis it phased, but also continuously finding effective ways to move forward. We have invested in right tools and technology to stay connected and provide business connectivity to our members, and volunteers. Monthly events including AGMs, Mentoring, Outreach, Annual Planning day with Singapore office, New member special events etc were all converted to virtual using Zooms, Teams, Menti, Canva and other collaborative tools exploring features like polling, breakout rooms, and survey forms. Melbourne chapter was the first one to run an AGM successfully in May 2020 within 2 months of the lockdowns, which was shared with other chapters across Australia.

As we are now embarking to new normal, we are focusing on hybrid model to run all our events, providing options to our members to attend face to face or online. This model has resulted in improved member participation and improved satisfaction of value from chapter. 

With the Lecturer responsible for providing the Project Management course to Masters of Biotechnology students going on leave, we volunteered to step in and deliver 5 of the sessions within this course. This has required significant curation of the course content, as well as the delivery of this on the day, including the hosting of workshops, and provision of support to the students. There were approximately 110 students participating in each session.

So what's next for the Outreach Portfolio? We are about to commence an initiative that focusses on further engagement of students, the Student Ambassador Program. This program aims to enhance students' employability by offering training in skills often not taught in academia, including knowledge of project management. The initial objectives are to:

- increase the awareness of students across Melbourne universities and colleges of the importance and value of project management skills through establishing informal meet-up groups and providing formal training
- appoint student ambassadors who will evangelise the use of project management as a discipline in their academic assignments and projects

We have also agreed to provide project management mentorship to five Year 8 students at Alamanda College for their participation in the Aureus Racing - F1 in schools initiative. They are the current Victorian State Champions, as well as Australian National Finalists in this F1 STEM competition in schools to build the fastest racing car.

Furthermore, we have recently signed an agreement with **Mental Health Foundation Australia**. We have agreed to collaborate with them on their initiatives, providing them with project management support.
