For Project Managers, there is also the expectation to deliver and meet deadlines, while managing scope and budget. How might we reconcile these responsibilities with expectations of being more agile, delivering quicker and with leaner and fewer resources?

An agile mindset equips you to cope with deep uncertainty, ambiguity, and complexity in fast-moving environments. Whatever your project types, the agile mindset serves the Project Manager well.

We were indulged in an insightful session this July by - Dr Jen Fraham and Lena Ross the founders of the Agile Change Leadership Institute. They shared the five benefits of shifting to an agile mindset, their superpowers, and especially these 5 mindset shifts:

- Engagement to Empathy
- · Expert to Beginner
- · Perfection to Done
- Failure avoidance to Failure seeking
- Self-judgement to Self-compassion

Something most of us in the audience resonated with.

Since our annual speed dating event in February, the program has matched 21 mentees and 22 mentees. This year, we offered mentors a professional development opportunity via the CCL Boost course from the Centre for Creative Leadership. Thanks to a collaboration with the Adelaide Chapter, we are currently running a pilot study of a mentoring software platform to provide more structure and support for these mentoring journeys.

Our mid-year mentoring event July featured an outstanding talk by lan Sharpe on Transformational Leadership. He shared information on three key things that need strong emotional intelligence for "big" success for projects:

- · There is one program, but the WHY differs for every stakeholder
- Negotiating with difficult stakeholders by imagining what would help when you are the difficult stakeholder
- Personal resilience

In the following breakout sessions, our mentees shared how their mentors had guided them to network professionally, focusing on less rather than trying to achieve a lot and dealing with challenging people and situations. Mentors appreciated the exposure to different ideas and insights gained from mentees working in different industries and the quality of the pairings.

We would love to expand the pool of mentors so that more chapter members can benefit from this highly successful program. I hope the tips for mentors in our new series "Insights from our Mentors" inspire you to start your own mentoring journey.

#### MENTEES' 10 TOP TIPS FOR SUCCESSFUL MENTORING

How mentees get the most out of their mentoring relationship.

- 1. They adopt a positive attitude to change and career development.
- 2. They are open to sharing their current work issues and problems.
- 3. They have the willingness to decide the direction they wish to take and to set achievable goals.
- 4. They reflect on their ambitions, values and choices.
- 5. They demonstrate an openness to ideas and experiences.
- 6. They are open to learning about their own strengths and weaknesses.
- 7. They are willing to negotiate mentoring arrangements with their mentor.
- 8. They have the time available to commit to regular meetings.
- 9. They conform to the mentoring agreement set by PMI.
- 10. They respect the boundaries set by the mentor.

#### MENTORS' 10 TOP TIPS FOR SUCCESSFUL MENTORING

A good mentoring relationship exists when Mentors:

- 1. Consider the relationship as equal and not a relationship where the mentor is the expert and the mentee is the student.
- 2. Do not need to show their own cleverness and superior learning.
- 3. Respect the mentee as the expert of their own experiences, feelings, ambitions and preferences.
- 4. Rely on the mentee to set the pace and direction.
- 5. Have the ability to listen and offer suggestions rather than advice.
- 6. Do not sit in judgement.
- 7. Provide the mentee with examples from their own experience to illustrate problem solving and solutions.
- 8. Identify any risks that the mentee may have not seen and suggest ways to mitigate against risks.
- 9. Have a genuine wish for the mentee to succeed.
- Understand the difficulties and barriers that the mentee may face at times.
