PMI Melbourne Chapter Events: A Look Back at the Last Five Months

The Melbourne Chapter has successfully hosted a diverse range of workshops and networking sessions, fostering a strong community of project management professionals and celebrating continued growth and success. These are the past events of 2025.

Building Connections Beyond the City — Empowering Project Professionals Across Victoria

The PMI Melbourne Chapter achieved a major milestone in June by hosting its first-ever regional event at Little Creatures Brewery in Geelong. The gathering attracted over 30 members and provided a relaxed yet engaging environment for networking, knowledge sharing, and community building.

This initiative reflects the Chapter's commitment to expanding its reach beyond metropolitan Melbourne and strengthening engagement with members across Victoria. Supported by local sponsor Baba Yaga Coffee House, the event delivered value for both experienced project managers and new members, highlighting strong interest in continued regional activities.

The success of this inaugural event establishes a strong foundation for future regional meetups, reinforcing PMI Melbourne's mission to build an inclusive and connected project management community throughout the state.



Future Ready: Shaping the Next Generation of Project Professionals

The PMI Melbourne Chapter recently hosted its inaugural Monthly Breakfast Event, focused on the theme "Future Ready: The Project Profession in 2025 and Beyond." The event brought together members and guests for insightful discussions on the evolving landscape of project management and its implications for professionals today and in the future.

Industry experts shared key insights into the Australian project management job market, emphasizing current trends, high-demand skills, and emerging career opportunities. Additionally, a deep dive into PMI's Global Talent Gap Report highlighted the projected global shortfall of 30 million project professionals by 2035, underscoring the scale of opportunity ahead, particularly in Australia and New Zealand.

The event was well received, with strong attendance and engagement, marking a successful step by the PMI Melbourne Chapter in building a thriving, future-focused project management community.

Scaling Generative AI: Driving Innovation Across APAC Projects

On 9 October 2025, a webinar on Scaling Generative AI in APAC Projects will bring together industry leaders to explore how organizations in the region can move beyond isolated pilots and achieve enterprise wide adoption of Generative AI. With closed caption translations available in Japanese, Korean, Malay, Tagalog, and Hindi, the session will highlight the unique challenges and opportunities shaped by APAC's diverse industries and cultures. The discussion will feature Geetha Gopal, Founder & CEO of G Infinity Consulting (Singapore), Vikki Kapoor, PMO Manager at Ericsson (Australia & NZ), and Nicole Hobbs, Director of Project Management at Microsoft (Australia & NZ), and will be hosted by Rupal Bhandari, Global Thought Leadership Specialist at PMI. Key topics include scaling GenAI across enterprises, building communities of practice to accelerate learning, championing experimentation for sustainable innovation, and harnessing GenAI to enhance efficiency and drive organizational change.



Cyber Resilience Starts with the Essential Eight

In 2021-22, the Australian Cyber Security Centre (ACSC) recorded over 76,000 cybercrime reports—equating to one every seven minutes and a 13% increase from the previous year—highlighting the escalating cyber threat environment. To address these risks, the ACSC developed the Essential Eight, a cybersecurity framework aimed at strengthening organizational resilience and lifting the national cybersecurity maturity baseline. Built on the Australian Signals Directorate's expertise in threat intelligence, incident response, and penetration testing, the framework provides a baseline defense against common attacks such as ransomware and phishing.

The Essential Eight Mitigation Strategies are:

1. Patch applications
2. Patch operating systems
3. Multi-factor authentication
4. Restrict administrative privileges
5. Application control
6. Restrict Microsoft Office macros
7. User application hardening
8. Regular backups

Implementing these measures significantly reduces the likelihood and impact of cyber incidents. Project managers (PMs), with their ability to coordinate across teams and align business and security priorities, are well positioned to lead the adoption and integration of these strategies within organizations.

Reflecting on Success, Shaping Tomorrow's Leaders (Annual General Meeting)

The PMI Melbourne Chapter 2025 Annual General Meeting and May Monthly Event brought together members to celebrate achievements, welcome new leadership, and envision the future of the Chapter. The highlight of the event was an inspiring workshop, *Unlocking Quiet Power*, delivered by Niamh O'Brien. This engaging session emphasized that leadership and influence are not limited to those in the spotlight but can also be demonstrated through presence, self-assurance, and thoughtful communication. Participants explored strategies to let their excellence and values speak for them, the importance of posture, eye contact, and non-verbal cues, and the role of self-regulation and confidence in high-pressure environments. The workshop underscored that quiet strength is powerful strength, leaving attendees affirmed, equipped, and inspired to embrace diverse forms of leadership.

Scaling Generative AI

The PMI Melbourne Chapter September Monthly Event, *A Framework for AI Use in Project Management*, focuses on guiding project managers through the intersection of traditional methods and transformative technologies. The session, led by Dr. Michael Rowe, introduces a practical framework based on five interconnected principles that promote ethical and effective AI adoption while maintaining professional judgment, team cohesion, and stakeholder trust. Participants will gain strategies to evaluate AI tools through a strategic lens, ensuring accountability, reducing bias, and securing long-term sustainability in AI driven projects. Designed for leaders seeking to navigate change with confidence, this event equips project managers with critical thinking and decision-making skills to lead teams through transformation, emphasizing that AI adoption is not just about tools but about fostering an AI-enabled leadership mindset.

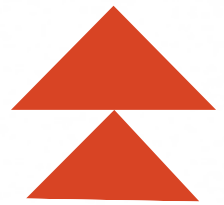
